What's Next?

STEP 1: Tell Us Your Plans

- If you plan to live on campus, send your \$500 deposit (\$200 enrollment fee and \$300 housing deposit) to the HCHC Office of Admissions by **May 1**. Deposits received after May 1 will be processed on a first come, first served basis, based on available spots.
- If you plan to commute, send your \$200 enrollment fee to the HCHC Office of Admissions no later than **May 1**.

You can choose to mail in your Enrollment Deposit Form with payment (check or money order) or pay by credit card by contacting the Bursar at **617.850.1272**. Check and money order payments should be made payable to Hellenic College, Inc. Please include your full name on the memo line. Please note that housing deposits are non-refundable after **June 1**.

Once your enrollment deposit is received, we will send you the HCHC Health and Housing forms, which need to be completed and returned to us by **July 1**.

OFFICE OF STUDENT LIFE

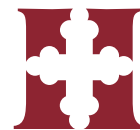

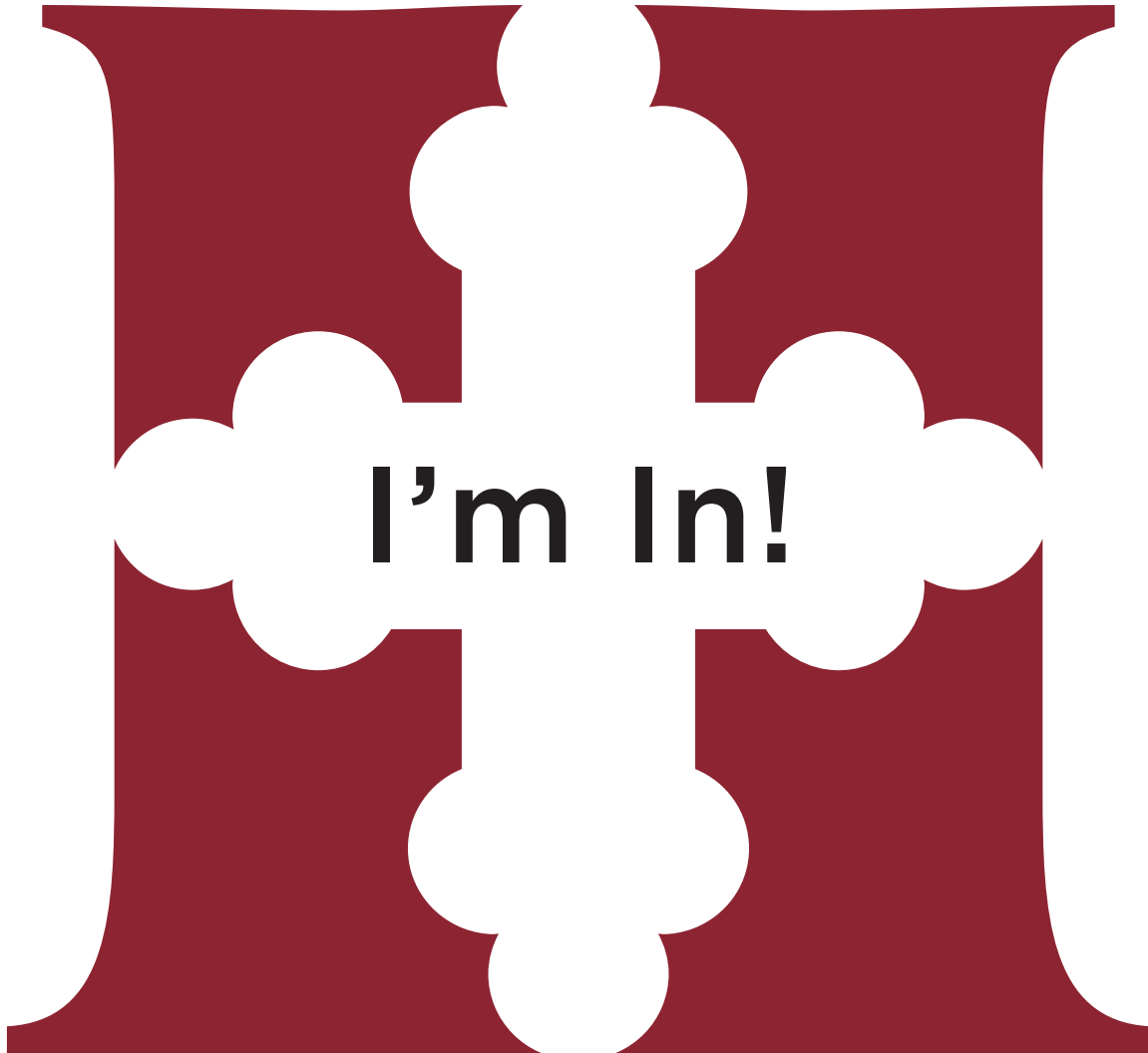
